An avid community servant and disability community advocate, Norma serves as Community Outreach Ministry leader for Salt and Light Truth Center in Decatur, GA, and oversees a ministry for families of children with special needs. She is also a graduate of Georgia's All About Developmental Disabilities' Partners In Policymaking Program and is a board member of Abel2 Non Profit, which works to bring visibility and employment to performing artists who are differently-able.

An award-winning professional, Norma has been honored over the years for her professional and community service by a number of organizations, including the Public Relations Society of America, All Children Are Special, Inc's Champion Award; They Can't Talk But We Can, Inc., Parental Advocacy Award and In March 2017, Norma was among select honorees nationwide who received President Barack Obama's Presidential Lifetime Achievement Award, for their commitment to community service and volunteerism.

Norma is also a freelance journalist, radio show host and best-selling author. Her first book is an inspirational book of testimonies, poems and reflections primarily for and about mothers of special needs children. The book is entitled, "The Elected Lady—Finding Victory in the Challenge. (Words of Faith, Reflections and Inspiration for Mothers of Special Needs Children and Other Moms.". Her second book, "Just Do It! (Ten Tips for Avoiding the Dream Stealing Trap of Procrastination)" is due for release in January 2018. Her first independent music CD project called, "Nella-Joi," is due for release in summer 2017.
